- 2007 Changes to Drivers' Hours Law

Drivers have the right to be fully informed and operators have a legal responsibility to ensure that the drivers are conversant with the law which affects them and the operator.

Investing in training the work force will protect the operators licence, improve OCRS score rating and assist in operational efficiency. It will reduce the number of fixed penalty fines, reduce the number of licence points for the driver and avoid driving disqualifications.

Improvement in the image of the company by enhancing the customers perception of the organisation. Increasing job security for all employees and increased job satisfaction for drivers particularly. Raising awareness of disability to protect the company against discrimination issues and litigation.

What is periodic training?

- Every professional driver has to undertake 35 hours of training during each 5 year period, in order to maintain the driver CPC.
- Best practice to maximise efficient implementation of driver CPC requirements would be to undertake 7 hours of training per year.
- Each module has to consist of 7 hours of trainer contact in a 24 hour period.
- Each training course has to be approved and carried out at an approved centre by approved trainers.
- There is no pass or fail requirement.
- A certificate of attendance is issued at the end of each completed 7 hour module.
- Once 35 hours of training is achieved a DQC (driver qualification card) is issued by the DVLA.

LGV: C1, C1+E, C or C+E

PCV: D1, D1+E, D or D+E

Courses registration: 8.30am - 9.00am

Course duration: 9.00am - 5.00pm Includes lunch and refreshments.
